

PE Kit

You need your PE kit in school at all times. You will have a set P.E day however sometimes we may do extra activities where you need your kit. This comprises of a white t-shirt, navy blue shorts, white socks and trainers (outside).

In the winter, you should bring a tracksuit (any colour). No jewellery is to be worn and please remember you also need a hair band if you have long hair. If you are going to have your ears pierced over the summer, it is best to do it at the start of the holiday so that they have plenty of time to heal before September's PE lessons.

Outdoor Shoes

Equipment

Home / School Contact

You will be given another planner to use during Year 2. Read the important information in it with your parents/carers at the beginning of term. It is really important that you bring the planner to school every day. If your parents/carers have written a note to us, please show us your planner in the morning.

There will be parents evenings during the year where your teacher, parents/carers and yourself can discuss your progress.

Behaviour

The school rules and behaviour charts work in the same way as in year 1. Remember that you should be showing your best behaviour at all times. .

It is going to be a hard (but fun) year. We have very high expectations of you academically and will be ensuring you do your best at all times. In June you will take national tests called SATs. More information will be given about these tests closer to the date but we will work hard throughout the year to ensure you're ready.



Homework

As you know, all children at Regis Manor are asked to read to an adult 4x a week, and this counts as part of your homework. Write down the book title and pages that you have read each day, then please ask your parents/carers to sign your planner weekly; we are always interested to read their comments about your reading. If you have a book at home that you would like to use as a reading book, that is fine. If not you can choose one from the book corner or we will give you a stage book if needed.

On most weeks, you will receive numeracy and spelling homework. The homework will link to the work you have been learning in class for that week. You will also be set a creative task to complete at home.

You will also have mathletics tasks set every week, you will have time in school to do this but you can also complete them at home. Your parents/carers can set up their own account to see how well you are doing!

If there is a reason why your homework cannot be given in on time, please ask your parents/carers to write a note in your planner.

To keep them looking smart, please do not write or draw on the cover of any of your books.

Organisation

You need to take responsibility for remembering what you need for school and to hand your homework in on time.

If you lose something that belongs to you, try lost property. If you have tried really hard to look for something yourself but still can't find it, an adult will help.

It makes a big difference if all your equipment is named—things can be returned to you quickly if we know who it belongs to! This is particularly true with uniform as one top looks that same as another.
